

**CEGG** is a *teaching* guild open to anyone interested in traditional and/or contemporary embroidery with offerings from goldwork, wool applique, fibre arts and much more. CEGG instructors are of the highest calibre. They take great pleasure in sharing their knowledge with members of every skill level from beginner to advanced. You are warmly welcome to join us!

**Each year CEGG runs two sessions of classes.** The Fall session runs Sep – Dec; the Winter session is Jan – Apr. Each spring CEGG hosts a show of members' embroidery from classes and personal work.

Associate membership is \$50. It includes afternoon programs, but no classes. All members pay for their own supplies, coffee/tea and receive invites to low cost CEGG-arranged workshops and field trips.



Registration Day is Tuesday, September 9, 10:00a.m. – noon at Kortright Presbyterian Church, 55 DeVere Street, Guelph, ON.

On Registration Day the class instructors will display samples of the techniques they will teach and provide a materials list for their classes. They enjoy chatting with potential students then.

**To register for classes,** complete the Registration/Volunteer Information form (*CEGGregvolform.pdf*) and bring it to Registration Day, **or** come and fill out a hard copy that CEGG provides. On the form, please specify your top 3 classes in your preferred order for both Fall and Winter sessions. Some classes require a prerequisite. CEGG strives for fair assignment to classes where member selections exceed the maximum size. If not selected for your 1<sup>st</sup> choice of class, you will be assigned to either your 2<sup>nd</sup> or 3<sup>rd</sup> choice. **Everyone will be notified of their new classes via phone or email by September 12.** 

**There are no advance registrations.** You are strongly urged to attend Registration Day on September 9. ## Selecting your appropriate class level

Each class is identified by skill level. If you have any questions about whether your skills will match the instructor's expectations, be sure to ask the instructor directly.

**Basic classes** are strongly recommended for new and returning members who need guidance with stitch patterns or who are new to techniques. They are taught by different instructors every year. Feel free to take them several times. There is always something new to learn.

**Intermediate classes** are for members who understand basic stitch patterns but may need guidance; and/or have taken the technique or similar one at the basic level; and/or have a basic understanding of colour and design.

**Advanced classes** are for members who can read charts and stitch diagrams with ease; have a good understanding of stitch technique; have obtained a working knowledge of colour and design; and are able to work independently.

## **Class Days**

Class Days occur about every other Tuesday throughout the Fall and Winter sessions. They hum with excitement and friendship. You will find a new and different display of members' work each class day. The library features the best up-to-date books and magazines for you to explore and borrow. Coffee, tea and treats round out the warmth of the meetings.
